<p>Standards for Civics and Economics examine the roles citizens play in the political, governmental, and economic systems in the United States. Students will examine the constitutions of Virginia and the United States, will identify the rights, duties, and responsibilities of citizens, and will describe the structure and operation of government at the local, state, and national levels. Students will investigate the process by which decisions are made in the American market economy and explain the government's role in it. The standards identify personal character traits, such as patriotism, respect for the law, willingness to perform public service, and a sense of civic duty, that facilitate thoughtful and effective active participation in the civic life of an increasingly diverse democratic society.</p> <p>Civic education also must emphasize the intellectual and practical skills required for responsible citizenship. Students will practice these skills both inside and outside the classroom as they extend their understanding of the essential knowledge defined by the standards for Civics and Economics.</p>			
<p>CE.1 The student will develop the social studies skills responsible citizenship requires, including the ability to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a) examine and interpret primary and secondary source documents;b) create and explain maps, diagrams, tables, charts, graphs, and spreadsheets;c) analyze political cartoons, political advertisements, pictures, and other graphic media;d) distinguish between relevant and irrelevant information;e) review information for accuracy, separating fact from opinion;f) identify a problem, weigh the expected costs and benefits and possible consequences of proposed solutions, and recommend solutions, using a decision-making model;g) formulate an informed, carefully reasoned position on a community issue;h) select and defend positions in writing, discussion, and debate.			
<p>Standard CE.1 will not be taught as an isolated unit. The skills included in this standard will form the foundation for the other standards and will be integrated into the other standards as they are covered throughout the academic semester.</p>
